NEW STUDENT ORIENTATION | To assist new students in making a successful transition into the campus community, orientation programs are offered at the beginning of each semester.

Fall Orientation: Held in late August, this weekend program for first-year and transfer students includes events and social activities designed to help students meet each other and become familiar with campus. Upperclass student mentors assist staff with this program.

Spring Orientation: Held in early January, this evening program acquaints all new students with the programs, services and resources available at the University.

UNIVERSITY JUDICIAL SYSTEM | Supervision of the University Judicial System is the responsibility of the Dean of Students and the Office of Student Life. Violations of the Code of Student Conduct and University policies are adjudicated by the University Judicial System. The process is designed to be educational in nature and to promote responsibility and accountability.

UNIVERSITY BANDS | The Jam Blues Marching Band, Pep Band and Jazz Band are musical ensembles available on campus. Student musicians are also invited to perform with the West Hills Symphonic Band.
