Top Story - The Robert Morris University football team returns home to Joe Walton Stadium Saturday afternoon looking to snap a two-game slide when it hosts Stony Brook for a 1:00 p.m. Northeast Conference tilt. The Colonials are coming off a 14-0 loss @ Monmouth (10/22/05) to drop RMU to 0-4 on the road so far in 2005. At home, Robert Morris has won two of its first three games in its inaugural season at "The Joe", including a 38-30 win over Wagner (10/8) in its last home game. In three games at Joe Walton Stadium, the Colonials have averaged 38.3 points per game. Robert Morris will travel to Albany Saturday, Nov. 5, to close out its 2005 road slate before returning home to square off with Sacred Heart in the 2005 season finale.

Quick Stat of the Afternoon - The Robert Morris defense has come to play each of the last two weeks, holding its opponents to season lows in **back-to-back** weeks in **first downs**, **passing yards** and **total offense**. After holding Central Connecticut State to 17 first downs, 179 yards passing and 311 yards of total offense, the Colonials stuffed Monmouth and allowed just 14 first downs, 99 yards passing and 272 yards of total offense. In the last three games, the RMU secondary has come through, as well, allowing its opponents an average of just 193 passing yards per game and coming up with six interceptions, including two by junior linebacker **Jeff Rommes**.

Saturday's Opponent - Saturday's matchup between Stony Brook and Robert Morris marks the seventh meeting, with the Colonials holding a 5-1 advantage in the all-time series. The Colonials have won the last two games in the series and are also a perfect 3-0 against the Seawolves at home, including a 23-20 victory in the last meeting between the two clubs in Moon Township (10/4/03). In last year's meeting between the two clubs, quarterback **Drew Geyer's** 45-yard touchdown pass to former split end **Dante Settles** (2000-05) with just 38 seconds to play lifted RMU to a 31-24 victory at LaValle Stadium in Stony Brook.

In all, the Colonials have averaged 33.0 points in six games against Stony Brook ... The Seawolves only victory against Robert Morris came at LaValle Stadium with a 23-13 win (11/9/02) in which quarterback **Drew Geyer**, at the time a

freshman, established the single-game school record for passing attempts (49) ... In last year's victory at LaValle Stadium senior running back **Devin Wilson** established a career-high with 139 rushing yards on 20 carries while also scoring two touchdowns.

Head Coach Joe Walton 12th Season - Pittsburgh '57



If there has been one constant associated with Robert Morris University football through the program's first 12 years, it has been Joe Walton. He was named head coach on July 27, 1993. He started the program from scratch, including everything from hiring assistant coaches to purchasing equipment to recruiting student-athletes. His fingerprints are all over the program, and to prove that, he had the University's first on-campus football stadium named in his honor. Joe Walton Stadium hosts its first game in 2005.

"I've said this many times before, and I mean it when I say that this situation is one of the best things that has happened to me in my life," Walton said. "It happened at the right time. Before this position became available, I felt I was too young to quit coaching, but I wasn't anxious to get back into pro football. When this came along, it was the perfect fit. This situation was the perfect opportunity for me to continue to do what I like to do, and I've loved every minute of it."

Under Walton's tutelage, the Colonials have claimed five Northeast Conference titles and a pair of mid-major national crowns in the program's first 11 years of existence. Robert Morris is one of just two programs to claim a pair of victories in the ECAC Classic, having won it in back-to-back seasons in 1996 and 1997. The success has done nothing to dampen Walton's enthusiasm for coaching football at Robert Morris, and with him on the sideline RMU wins nearly 70 percent of the time.

Walton is RMU's only head coach ever, and he is 75-42-1 (all at Robert Morris) at the collegiate level (.640). Walton was the head coach of the New York Jets from 1983-89, when he went 53-57-1 (.482). That seven-year mark ranks second in the NFL club's history in wins to the late Weeb Eubank. Also included among Walton's 35 NFL seasons is two (1990-91) as offensive coordinator for the Pittsburgh Steelers. A two-time All-America tight end at Pittsburgh, Walton played eight years in the NFL with the Washington Redskins and New York Giants.

GAME RECAP

Kessler Field Attendance: 1,882 - Robert Morris committed a season-high five turnovers and Monmouth turned two of those into touchdowns to help lead the Hawks to a 14-0 victory over the Colonials. Monmouth scored its first touchdown of the afternoon when freshman quarterback **Erik Cwalinski** fumbled the snap on RMU's 19 yard-line, and two plays later Hawk signal caller Brian Boland connected Shane Sharpley for an 18-yard touchdown pass. On RMU's next drive, Cwalinski again fumbled the snap, and this time Monmouth linebacker T.J. Cerezo picked up the loose ball and scrambled 44 yards to the end zone for a touchdown. Senior **Devin Wilson** compiled 102 all-purpose yards to lead Robert Morris.

The Top Five - Senior halfback **Devin Wilson** moved into the RMU top five for all-time rushing yards in 2005 and enters Saturday's game against Stony Brook with 1,536 career rushing yards on 382 carries, an average of 4.0 yards a carry. Wilson is in just his second season as the starting halfback for RMU and as a starter has gained 1,220 yards on 302 carries, an average of 4.0 yards a carry. **A look at the top five rushers in Robert Morris history:**

Dr. Jekyll & Mr. Hyde - The Robert Morris offense has had an up-and-down season thus far in 2005, as after scoring just 12 points in its season-opener @ Duquesne (9/3) averaged 35.6 points in their next four games. However, in the last two contests, RMU has scored just 14 points, including just its third shutout in school history with a 14-0 defeat @ Monmouth (10/22). The Colonials hope some home cooking will do the trick, as Robert Morris has averaged 38.3 points in its first three home games during its inaugural season at Joe Walton Stadium and over its 12-year history has averaged 30.7 points in home games.

Special Delivery - One of the main jobs of a special teams unit is to set its offense up with good field position. Robert Morris is in the midst of probably its best season on special teams, as the Colonials currently lead the Northeast Conference in both average kickoff (22.9 yards per return) and punt (11.4 yards per return) returns. RMU's single-season school record for average kickoff return is 25.9, set in 1997, while the record of average punt return is 12.2, established in 2000.

Speedy Delivery - The main reason for the success Robert Morris has had on special teams has come courtesy of senior **Tyjuan Massey**, who is averaging 30.5 yards on kickoff returns and 9.2 yards on punt returns. Massey returned just one kickoff @ Monmouth (10/22), scrambling 38 yards. It pushed his career total to 1,002 yards, the first Colonial in school history to eclipse 1,000 yards in either kickoff or punt returns. Massey broke former Colonial **Dante Settles (2000-04)** career school record of 948 kickoff return yards when he posted three kickoff returns for 57 yards @ Central Connecticut State (10/15).

Electricity - Senior flanker **Tyjuan Massey** has been an integral part of the Robert Morris receiving corps over the past three years, but he also proven to be a key cog as part of the special teams unit. That has never been more evident than the 2005 campaign. After returning three kickoffs a total of 132 yards @ Duquesne (9/3), Massey returned three punts 71 yards (23.7 yards per return) in a 49-13 win over Butler (9/17). Combined with his team-leading 22 catches for 469 yards, Massey enters Saturday's game against Stony Brook ranked second in the Northeast Conference in all-purpose yards per game (145.7), which also ranks 11th in I-AA. Massey's career-high 230 all-purpose yards @ Central Conn. State (10/15) helped him become just the fourth Colonial in school history to go over 3,000 career all-purpose yards. **A look at the top all-purpose performers in Robert Morris history:**

Over the course of the last four years, senior linebacker **James Noel** has become one of the rocks of the Robert Morris defense. He has led the Colonials in tackles over that span and has posted 100-tackle seasons in each of his first three years with the club, starting with 108 in 2002 en route to being named the Northeast Conference Defensive Rookie of the Year. On his career Noel owns 389 takedowns, a career record, and has etched his name as one of RMU's all-time greats. **A closer look at his career:**

- Over his four-year career owns **389** career tackles, a school record, and is averaging **10.2** tackles per game over his career

- Tied the single-season school record with 108 tackles in 2002, then established a new mark with **115** in **2004**
- Owns school record **21** career double-digit tackle games, including **two** in 2005 (13 tackles in a 38-30 victory over Wagner - 10/8; 12 tackles @ Central Conn. State - 10/15)
- Owns **14** career sacks, which ranks **sixth** all-time
- Has compiled a total of **43** tackles for losses that have equaled **117** yards
- Finished **third** in the Northeast Conference in 2004 in tackles per game (**10.5**) and tackles (**115**)
- Finished **second** in the NEC in 2003 in tackles per game (**10.7**) and tackles (**107**)
- Finished **third** in the NEC in 2002 in tackles per game (**10.8**) and **fifth** in tackles (**108**)
- Owns career totals of **10** passes defended, **two** interceptions, **five** forced fumbles, **two** fumble recoveries and **one** blocked kick

Dazzling Debut - Quarterback **Erik Cwalinski** became the fourth Robert Morris signal caller in school history to make his first collegiate start as a freshman @ Central Connecticut State (10/15), finishing 14-for-22 passing for 258 yards and two touchdowns, including a 79-yard touchdown pass to senior flanker **Tyjuan Massey**. Cwalinski's passing performance in his first collegiate start is the best by an RMU freshman quarterback. **A comparison of the four quarterbacks:**

Theatrical - Flanker **Tyjuan Massey's** 79-yard touchdown reception from freshman quarterback **Erik Cwalinski** @ Central Conn. State (10/15) put the senior in some select company in the Robert Morris record book. The reception marks the fifth career touchdown of 70 yards or longer by Massey, just the second Colonial in school history to turn the trick. Original Robert Morris running back **Tim Hall (1994-95)** scored seven career touchdowns that logged 70 yards or longer in his two years with the team. Massey owns touchdown receptions of 71 (twice), 79 and 93 yards and also owns a 94-yard kickoff return for a score. Hall owned five touchdown runs and two touchdown receptions of 70 yards or longer.

Three Amigos - After posting just three double-digit tackle games in the first five games of the 2005 season, three Colonials turned the trick @ Central Connecticut State (10/15). Senior defensive end **Michael Crandle** led the way with a career-high 13 tackles, while senior linebacker **James Noel** added 12 stops and junior defensive end **Ray Gensler** a career-high 11 takedowns. Noel's 12 tackles marks the second straight game in 2005 he's finished with double-digit tackles and extended his career record to 21. Crandle, meanwhile, established a career-high in tackles by finishing with eight @ Monmouth (10/22) and now owns 46 on the season. He also leads Robert Morris in tackles for a loss with 13, including a team-high two and-a-half sacks. Crandle enters Saturday's game vs. Stony Brook ranked tied for second in the Northeast Conference in tackles for a loss behind CCSU's Brian Sullivan (20).

Versatility - Senior flanker **Tyjuan Massey** registered the first rushing touchdown of his career in RMU's 38-30 victory over Wagner (10/8), sprinting 24 yards on an end-around to hit paydirt for a score early in the fourth quarter that gave the Colonials a 31-17 advantage. Massey became just the fourth Colonial in school history to score a touchdown three different ways, as he now owns a touchdown rushing, receiving and on special teams. On special teams, Massey returned the opening kickoff a school-record 94 yards in a 23-20 win over Stony Brook (10/4/03). Massey joins teammate **Devin Wilson**, former split end **Dante Settles (2000-04)** and former running back **Archie Wannamaker (1996-98)** as the only Colonials in school history to score a touchdown three different ways. Other than touchdowns rushing and receiving, Wilson owns a blocked punt return for a touchdown, Settles a punt return for a touchdown and Wannamaker a kick return for a touchdown.

Three's Company - To illustrate the depth the Colonials have at the skill positions and the ability to spread the ball around on offense, one needs to look no further than senior halfback **Devin Wilson**. Wilson finished with three touchdowns in RMU's 49-13 win over Butler (9/17) in the team's 2005 home opener, rushing for touchdowns of one and four yards and adding a 19-yard touchdown reception from senior quarterback **Drew Geyer** for his third score of the afternoon. Wilson became the first Colonial in almost seven years to score three touchdowns in a game, as the last time the feat was accomplished came in a 42-17 win over Central Connecticut State (9/26/98), when former running back **Archie Wannamaker (1996-98)** turned the trick, a span of 69 games.

D.J. Jazzy Jeff - Junior outside linebacker **Jeff Rommes** came through with one of his best performances as a Colonial in RMU's 38-30 win over Wagner (10/8), establishing a career-high with 12 tackles while also registering an interception and two passes defended. For those efforts he was named the Northeast Conference Defensive Player of the Week Oct. 10. Rommes is just the third Colonial to earn NEC Defensive Player of the Week honors in the last five years.

The Magic Mark - Since the Colonials began play in 1994 there have been 53 games in which Robert Morris has scored 30 or more points. In those contests RMU boasts a record of 50-3, including a record of 26-3 in games in which the team scores between 30 and 39 points. In games in which the Colonials score 40 or more points, RMU is a perfect 23-0. In its 116-game history, Robert Morris has eclipsed the 30-point plateau in 53 games, almost half of its games (45.7 percent).

Dynamic Duo

Over the course of the past three seasons, senior tight end **Rupert Rickards** and senior flanker **Tyjuan Massey** have become RMU's two most reliable receivers, combining to catch 171 passes for 3,122 yards. Over that same span, Rickards and Massey have accounted for 39.0 percent (171-of-438) of RMU's receptions. Also, Rickards and Massey's 171 combined receptions is the most in school history by a Robert Morris receiving tandem, eclipsing the 121 former tight end **Brent Hockenberry (2000-01)** and former wideout **Shawn Martin (1999-2002)** posted over the course of the 2000-01 seasons. Rickards owns 106 career catches, a school record, for 1,433 yards, an average of 13.5 yards per catch, while Massey owns 95 career receptions for 1,689 yards, a school record and an average of 17.8 yards a catch. The pair, barring injury, should finish as the top two receivers in school history in both receptions and receiving yards, as Rickards is just 63 yards from eclipsing former Colonial wide receiver **Fred Parker (1996-98)** for second in the career records for receiving yards. Massey eclipsed Parker's record with four catches for 52 yards in RMU's 38-30 win over Wagner (10/8). **A breakdown of Rickards and Massey over the last three years:**
