Top Story - The Robert Morris University football team travels to Albany, N.Y., for its final road game of the 2005 campaign Saturday when it takes on the Great Danes of the University at Albany at 4:00 p.m. The Colonials are coming off a 38-37 loss to Stony Brook at home to stretch their losing streak to three games and have yet to claim a victory on the road this season. RMU is averaging just 13.5 points in four road games in 2005 while allowing an average of 23.3 points a contest. Robert Morris will put a wrap on its 2005 season when it hosts Sacred Heart at "The Joe" Nov. 12 for a 1:00 p.m. tilt.

Quick Stat of the Afternoon - Arguably the most exciting player in the 12-year history of Robert Morris football and possibly the greatest wide receiver to ever don a Colonial uniform, senior flanker **Tyjuan Massey** put his stamp in the RMU record book against Stony Brook (10/29). Massey became just the **second** Colonial in school history to score **four** touchdowns in a game when he caught touchdown passes of **37, 9, 33** and **40** yards. Massey is the **first** receiver in school history to catch **four** touchdown passes and joins former running back **Tim Hall (1994-95)** as the only players to score four touchdowns in a game. Hall scored four touchdowns in a 38-14 win over Bethany (11/5/94) and in a 38-20 win @ Duquesne (9/16/95). Yet that is just the beginning ...

Saturday's Opponent - Robert Morris and Albany will face off for the seventh time in school history Saturday afternoon, with the Colonials holding a 4-2 edge in the all-time series. RMU snapped a two-game slide against the Great Danes with a 34-7 victory in the final home game at Moon Stadium (11/6) during the 2004 season. In that game quarterback **Drew Geyer** completed 15 of his 24 passing attempts for 293 yards and three touchdowns, including a 93-yard scoring strike to flanker **Tyjuan Massey** in the third quarter. Massey finished with four catches for a career-high 177 yards receiving and a touchdown in the win.

In RMU's last game at University Field the Colonials could muster just 94 total yards of offense ... Robert Morris came away with a 42-31 victory @ Albany

(11/10) during the 2001 season in which former quarterback **Tim Levick (1998-2001)** finished 19-for-32 passing for 207 yards and three touchdowns, while former linebacker **Reggie Chambers (1998-2001)** established an RMU single-game record with 20 tackles.

Head Coach Joe Walton 12th Season - Pittsburgh '57



If there has been one constant associated with Robert Morris University football through the program's first 12 years, it has been Joe Walton. He was named head coach on July 27, 1993. He started the program from scratch, including everything from hiring assistant coaches to purchasing equipment to recruiting student-athletes. His fingerprints are all over the program, and to prove that, he had the University's first on-campus football stadium named in his honor. Joe Walton Stadium hosts its first game in 2005.

"I've said this many times before, and I mean it when I say that this situation is one of the best things that has happened to me in my life," Walton said. "It happened at the right time. Before this position became available, I felt I was too young to quit coaching, but I wasn't anxious to get back into pro football. When this came along, it was the perfect fit. This situation was the perfect opportunity for me to continue to do what I like to do, and I've loved every minute of it."

Under Walton's tutelage, the Colonials have claimed five Northeast Conference titles and a pair of mid-major national crowns in the program's first 11 years of existence. Robert Morris is one of just two programs to claim a pair of victories in the ECAC Classic, having won it in back-to-back seasons in 1996 and 1997. The success has done nothing to dampen Walton's enthusiasm for coaching football at Robert Morris, and with him on the sideline RMU wins nearly 70 percent of the time.

Walton is RMU's only head coach ever, and he is 75-43-1 (all at Robert Morris) at the collegiate level (.634). Walton was the head coach of the New York Jets from 1983-89, when he went 53-57-1 (.482). That seven-year mark ranks second in the NFL club's history in wins to the late Weeb Eubank. Also included among Walton's 35 NFL seasons is two (1990-91) as offensive coordinator for the Pittsburgh Steelers. A two-time All-America tight end at Pittsburgh, Walton played eight years in the NFL with the Washington Redskins and New York Giants.

GAME RECAP

Joe Walton Stadium Attendance: 1,439 - Josh Dudash's 12-yard touchdown pass to Joe Tarasiewicz with 6:02 to play completed a 17-point comeback as Stony Brook defeated RMU, 38-37. The Colonials owned a 31-14 lead in the second quarter but the Seawolves outscored Robert Morris, 24-6, in the last 31 minutes of the game.

Records Are Made To Be Broken - Tyuan Massey's four touchdown game against Stony Brook (10/29) were two of an amazing eight school records that the senior flanker broke on the afternoon. As well as establishing a single-game record for receiving touchdowns and tying the single-game record for scores, Massey pushed his season total of touchdown catches to nine, a new single-season record. The four touchdown catches also pushed his career total to 20, tying the RMU career record that was originally established by former wideout **Fred Parker (1996-98)**. In other records, Massey's 131 yards receiving gave him three 100-yard receiving game on the year, tying the single-season record that was originally established by former tight end **Brent Hockenberry (2000-01)**, while it also pushes his career total to six, tying Hockenberry's mark. For kickoff returns, Massey's six against the Seawolves established a new single-game record, while his 149 yards on those six returns pushed his season total 545, a new single-season record.

Electricity - While senior flanker **Tyjuan Massey** has been an integral part of the Robert Morris receiving corps over the past three years, he also proven to be a key cog as part of the special teams unit. That has never been more evident than the 2005 campaign. Against Stony Brook (10/29), Massey racked up **286** all-purpose yards on the afternoon, which ranks second in the single-game annals behind former running back **Tim Hall (1994-95)**, who finished with 298 vs. Bethany (11/5/94). Combined with his team-leading 27 catches for 600 yards, Massey enters Saturday's game @ Albany **leading** the Northeast Conference in all-purpose yards per game (163.2), which also ranks **fifth** in I-AA. **A look at the top all-purpose performers in Robert Morris history:**

Flowing In the Wind - To take an even deeper look at flanker **Tyjuan Massey's** season, the senior is the only wide receiver to rank in the top 10 in all of I-AA in all-purpose yards per game, with each of the other nine being running backs, players who touch the ball a lot more during the game than wide receivers. Dr. Jekyll & Mr. Hyde - The Robert Morris offense has had an up-and-down season thus far in 2005, as after scoring just 12 points in its season-opener @ Duquesne (9/3) averaged 35.6 points in their next four games. However, in the next two contests, RMU scored just 14 points, including just its third shutout in school history with a 14-0 defeat @ Monmouth (10/22). The Colonials rebounded to score 37 points at home against Stony Brook (10/29) and will look to continue that offensive prowess Saturday @ Albany.

Pick It - For the second time on the 2005 campaign RMU came up with three interceptions, this time against Stony Brook (10/29), as junior defensive lineman **Ray Gensler**, sophomore safety **James Kazil** and sophomore linebacker **Chad Wengert** each came up with picks. In the last four games, Robert Morris has tallied 10 interceptions, including all two by Kazil, who leads the Colonials with three picks.

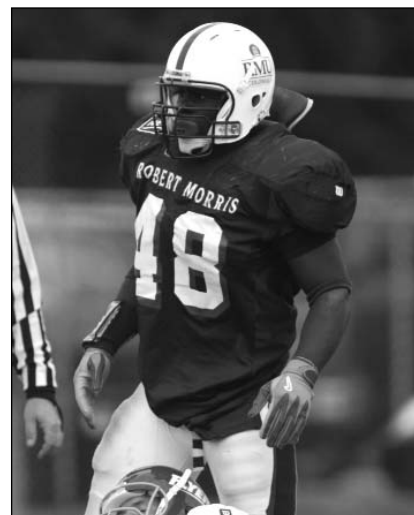
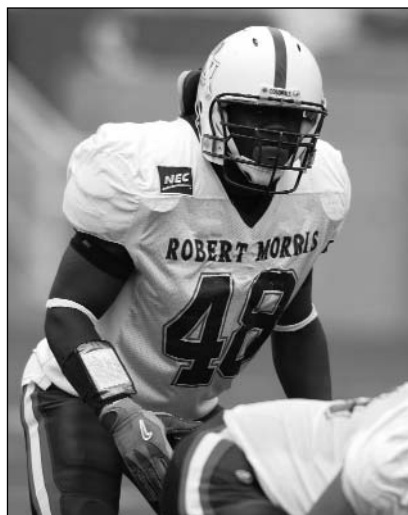
Over the course of the last four years, senior linebacker **James Noel** has become one of the rocks of the Robert Morris defense. He has led the Colonials in tackles over that span and has posted 100-tackle seasons in each of his first three years with the club, starting with 108 in 2002 en route to being named the Northeast Conference Defensive Rookie of the Year. On his career Noel owns 404 takedowns, a career record, and has become just the second player in NEC history to eclipse 400 career tackles. **A closer look at his career:**

- Finished **second** in the NEC in 2003 in tackles per game (**10.7**) and tackles (**107**)
- Finished **third** in the NEC in 2002 in tackles per game (**10.8**) and **fifth** in tackles (**108**)
- Owns career totals of **10** passes defended, **two** interceptions, **five** forced fumbles, **two** fumble recoveries and **one** blocked kick

Super Sub - Senior quarterback **Drew Geyer**, subbing for injured starter **Erik Cwalinski**, had one of the most complete performances of his career against Stony Brook (10/29). Geyer finished 20-for-35 passing for a career-high 313 yards and five touchdowns while, more importantly, not throwing an interception. It marked the first game of the 2005 campaign a Colonial signal caller did not throw an interception in a game. Geyer's performance against the Seawolves pushed him into second place all-time at Robert Morris and in the Northeast Conference annals for career passing yards with 5,963. It also marked Geyer's 17th career game of throwing for more than 200 yards, eclipsing former signal caller **Tim Levick's (1998-2001)** old record of 16. In seven games this season, Geyer has completed 95 of his 179 passing attempts (53.1 percent) for 14 touchdowns against eight interceptions.

The Top Five - Senior halfback **Devin Wilson** moved into the RMU top five for all-time rushing yards in 2005 and enters Saturday's game @ Albany with 1,536 career rushing yards on 398 carries, an average of 4.0 yards a carry. Wilson is in just his second season as the starting halfback for RMU and over the last two years has shared carries with senior fullback **Vince Magnone**. Combined over the last two season, Wilson and Magnone have rushed for 2,041 yards on 492 carries, an average of 4.1 yards a rush.

Chicks Dig The Long Ball - Senior signal caller **Drew Geyer** has proven his flair for the dramatic time and time again over his four-year career and did it again against Stony Brook (10/29), registering his seventh touchdown pass of 70 yards or longer when he connected with senior halfback **Devin Wilson** for a 74-yard score. Of those seven touchdown passes, three have gone to senior flanker **Tyjuan Massey**.

Select Company - Senior linebacker **James Noel** registered a team-high 15 tackles against Stony Brook (10/29), extending his school record of double-digit tackle games to 22. Even more impressive is that Noel pushed his career tackle total to 404, becoming just the second player in Northeast Conference history to eclipse 400 career take-downs. Former Sacred Heart linebacker Kayode Mayowa (1999-2002) owns the NEC career record for tackles with 447.

Theatrical - Flanker **Tyjuan Massey's** 79-yard touchdown reception from freshman quarterback **Erik Cwalinski** @ Central Conn. State (10/15) put the senior in some select company in the RMU record book. The reception marks the fifth career touchdown of 70 yards or longer by Massey, just the second Colonial in school history to turn the trick. Original Robert Morris running back **Tim Hall (1994-95)** scored seven career touchdowns that logged 70 yards or longer in his two years with the team. Massey owns touchdown receptions of 71 (twice), 79 and 93 yards and also owns a 94-yard kickoff return for a score.

D.J. Jazzy Jeff - Junior outside linebacker **Jeff Rommes** came through with one of his best performances as a Colonial in RMU's 38-30 win over Wagner (10/8), establishing a career-high with 12 tackles while also registering an interception and two passes defended. For those efforts he was named the Northeast Conference Defensive Player of the Week Oct. 10. Rommes is just the third Colonial to earn NEC Defensive Player of the Week honors in the last five years.

The Magic Mark - Since the Colonials began play in 1994 there have been 54 games in which Robert Morris has scored 30 or more points. In those contests RMU boasts a record of 50-4, including a record of 26-4 in games in which the team scores between 30 and 39 points. In games in which the Colonials score 40 or more points, RMU is a perfect 23-0.

Dynamic Duo

Over the course of the past three seasons, senior tight end **Rupert Rickards** and senior flanker **Tyjuan Massey** have become RMU's two most reliable receivers, combining to catch 177 passes for 3,255 yards. Over that same span, Rickards and Massey have accounted for 38.4 percent (177-of-461) of RMU's receptions. Also, Rickards and Massey's 177 combined receptions is the most in school history by a Robert Morris receiving tandem, eclipsing the 121 former tight end **Brent Hockenberry (2000-01)** and former wideout **Shawn Martin (1999-2002)** posted over the course of the 2000-01 seasons. Rickards owns 107 career catches, a school record, for 1,435 yards, an average of 13.4 yards per catch, while Massey owns 100 career receptions for 1,820 yards, a school record and an average of 18.2 yards a catch. The pair, barring injury, should finish as the top two receivers in school history in both receptions and receiving yards, as Rickards is just 59 yards from eclipsing former Colonial wide receiver **Fred Parker (1996-98)** for second in the career records for receiving yards. Massey eclipsed Parker's record with four catches for 52 yards in RMU's 38-30 win over Wagner (10/8). **A breakdown of Rickards and Massey over the last three years:**
