Top Story - The Robert Morris University football team opens its 2006 campaign and 13th season of intercollegiate football Saturday, Sept. 2, when it travels to Dayton, Ohio, for a 1:00 p.m. contest against the University of Dayton. The Colonials own a record of 8-4 all-time in season openers dating back to the program's first season in 1994. Under the tutelage of 13th-year head coach Joe Walton, the only head coach in the history of the program, the Colonials return a total of 12 starters in 2006, including six on the defensive side of the ball. After Saturday's season lidlifter at Dayton, the Colonials return home to open the home portion of their schedule when they host Duquesne at Joe Walton Stadium for a 1:00 p.m. tilt.

Quick Stat of the Afternoon - Thanks to Robert Morris returning 12 starters this season, a total of 10 Colonials will be making their first collegiate start Saturday at Dayton against the Flyers. The area that RMU will feature the most individuals making their first collegiate start is on the offensive line, as sophomore Ian Margerum and juniors Edgar Hunt and Joe Setticas get the nod. Margerum will start at left guard, while Hunt draws the starting assignment at right guard and Setticas at right tackle. The trio join veteran senior Gus Alonso, who enters his third year as the starting left tackle. Getting the start at center is junior John Steilner, who will make his first start at the position since 2004. Steilner started each of the last eight games at center in 2004 due to the injury of former Colonial center Vince Romo (2003-05).

Saturday's Opponent - After squaring off for seven straight years from 1996 to 2002, Saturday's contest against the Flyers is just the second meeting between the two clubs in the last four years and RMU's first visit to Dayton since 2002. The Flyers have won three straight in the series, including a 29-12 victory at Moon Stadium (10/16/04) in the last meeting between the pair of programs, and own a 6-2 edge in the all-time series against the Colonials.

Dayton Series Quick Outs - Dayton is one of just two programs (Sacred Heart being the other) that Robert Morris owns a losing record against in the all-time series with a minimum of five games played ... Since the inception of I-AA Mid-Major football in 1993, Dayton owns the best winning

percentage (.812) of the 21 programs at that classification, while Robert Morris ranks fourth (.624) ... RMU's 17-13 victory at Welcome Stadium (10/14/00) marked head coach Joe Walton's 100th victory as head coach (combined professional and collegiate victories).

## Head Coach Joe Walton 13th Season - Pittsburgh '57



If there has been one constant associated with Robert Morris University football through the program's first 12 years, it has been Joe Walton. He was named head coach on July 27, 1993. He started the program from scratch, including everything from hiring assistant coaches to purchasing equipment to recruiting student-athletes. His fingerprints are all over the program, and to prove that, he had the University's first on-campus football stadium named in his honor. Joe Walton Stadium hosted its first football game in 2005 to rousing success, as the Colonials defeated Butler, 49-13, on Sept. 17, 2005.

"I've said this many times before, and I mean it when I say that this situation is one of the best things that has happened to me in my life," Walton said. "It happened at the right time. Before this position became available, I felt I was too young to quit coaching, but I wasn't anxious to get back into pro football. When this came along, it was the perfect fit. This situation was the perfect opportunity for me to continue to do what I like to do, and I've loved every minute of it."

Under Walton's tutelage, the Colonials have claimed five Northeast Conference titles and a pair of mid-major national crowns in the program's first 12 years of existence. Robert Morris is one of just two programs to claim a pair of victories in the ECAC Classic, having won it in back-to-back seasons in 1996 and 1997. The success has done nothing to dampen Walton's enthusiasm for coaching football at Robert Morris, and with him on the sideline RMU wins nearly 70 percent of the time.

Walton is RMU's only head coach ever, and he is 75-45-1 (all at Robert Morris) at the collegiate level (.624). Walton was the head coach of the New York Jets from 1983-89, when he went 53-57-1 (.482). Also included among Walton's 35 NFL seasons is two (1990-91) as offensive coordinator for the Pittsburgh Steelers. A two-time All-America tight end at Pittsburgh, Walton played eight years in the NFL with the Washington Redskins and New York Giants.

*Joe Walton Stadium Attendance: 1,231 - Flanker Tyjuan Massey recorded single-game records for receptions (10), receiving yards (272) and all-purpose yards (349) but it wasn't enough as Sacred Heart downed the Colonials, 27-20, in the 2005 regular-season finale. Tyler Arciaga hooked up with Corey Bundy for touchdown passes of 78, 37 and 43 yards in helping the Pioneers take an early they would never relinquish. Bundy finished the afternoon with seven catches for 200 yards.*

Lidlifters - Robert Morris enters Saturday's game @ Dayton with a record of 8-4 in its 12 previous season openers, including a record of 3-4 in season openers on the road. The 2006 season lidlifter marks the second straight year the Colonials have opened a season away from home, as RMU dropped a 23-12 decision @ Duquesne (9/3/05) in its 2005 season opener. Some quick hits about Saturday's season opener ... Dayton is the fifth opponent that Robert Morris will open a season against ... For the first two years in RMU's history (1994-95), the Colonials opened with Waynesburg ... In 1996 the club opened the season with a 20-0 win @ Mercyhurst (9/7/96) ... For eight straight years from 1997 to 2004 Robert Morris opened its season with Division III Buffalo State, posting a record of 5-3 in those eight openers ... Robert Morris has averaged 29.2 points in season openers, including 22.3 points per game in its seven lidlifters on the road.

Welcome to the Jungle - Dotted amongst the two-deep for RMU's season-opener Saturday at Dayton are a total of seven freshmen either slated to start or backup. The most intriguing freshman that garners a starting spot against the Flyers Saturday is Brian Harden, who is penciled in as the starting halfback. Harden becomes just the second true freshman to garner a start at halfback in his first collegiate game, joining former Colonial Archie Wannamaker (1996-98). Wannamaker garnered his start in RMU's 1996 season opener, a 20-0 win @ Mercyhurst (9/7/96), and carried seven times for 68 yards, an average of 9.7 yards per carry. Wannamaker garnered the start against the Lakers due to a training camp injury to regular starter Ralph Clark (1994-97). The good omen for Harden is that the 1996 Colonials started the season 5-0, including shutouts of its first three opponents, and finished the year 9-2. Welcome Back - Despite the loss of the program's top two receivers in school history in former flanker Tyjuan Massey (2002-05) and former tight end Rupert Rickards (2002-05), the Colonials welcome back junior Mario Hines in 2006. Hines finished with 24 catches for 373 yards and two touchdowns as a freshman in 2004, then transferred to Akron. After participating in 2005 spring drills with the Zips, Hines returned to Robert Morris in the summer of 2005 but had to sit out last season due to NCAA transfer rules. Hines, along with returning senior split end Michael Rogers, should help the Colonials form a formidable duo at wide receiver in 2006.

It's Your Show - Sophomore Erik Cwalinski will enter his first full season as the starting quarterback for Robert Morris after receiving valuable playing time as a freshman in 2005. Cwalinski started four of RMU's last five games of the 2005 campaign and finished the year with passing numbers of 42-for-80 for 729 yards, four touchdowns and three interceptions. His best game of the season came in the club's 2005 season finale against Sacred Heart when he finished 13-for-29 passing for 307 yards and a touchdown.

Chicks Dig the Long Ball - Over the course of the past couple of seasons, Robert Morris has gone to the air a lot more than in the early years of the program. Seven of the 10 longest touchdown passes in school history have occurred in the last four years, mainly thanks to the arm of graduated quarterback Drew Geyer (2002-05). Sophomore Erik Cwalinski, who garners his first start in a season opener Saturday @ Dayton, didn't take long to show that his arm is a powerful one, as well. Cwalinski's 79-yard touchdown strike to former flanker Tyjuan Massey in his first collegiate start @ Central Connecticut State (10/15/05) ranks as the fifth longest scoring pass in school history.

**Welcome Back Part Deux** - While Robert Morris welcomes back junior Mario Hines to its wide receiving corps in 2006, the club's secondary will also get a boost with the return of senior Mike Niklos. Niklos sat out the 2005 campaign due to an ankle injury and received a medical redshirt but will look to get back to being one of the elite corners in the Northeast Conference. In 2003, Niklos set an NEC freshman record by registering six interceptions en route to being named the league's Defensive Rookie of the Year, and he enters 2006 with eight picks to his credit on his career.

**The Candy Man** - While freshman halfback Brian Harden garners his first collegiate start in his first collegiate game Saturday @ Dayton, he'll only need to look on the other side of the ball for Robert Morris to find a familiar face. Harden's high school teammate in freshman Jacky Candy also garners a start in his first collegiate game against the Flyers Saturday at cornerback. In 2005, Candy was the signal caller for Stranahan High School in Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., and threw for 818 yards and eight touchdowns in five games. Candy often handed the ball off to Harden, who rushed for 632 yards and six touchdowns on 90 carries in only seven games, an average of 7.0 yards a rush.

**Finishing Strong** - A number of Colonials who line up on the defensive side of the ball finished their 2005 seasons strong, and one can point to senior defensive lineman Ray Gensler as the prime example. Gensler finished fifth on the club in tackles in 2005 with 60 after starting in all 10 games at left end, but over the course of the last five games of the campaign averaged 8.6 tackles per contest. A solid pass rusher who finished tied for second in the Northeast Conference in sacks in 2004 with seven and-a-half, Gensler is the veteran piece of the 2006 Colonial defensive line.

**Anchorman** - Speaking of finishing strong, one of the most pleasant surprises on the Robert Morris defense in 2005 was junior defensive back James Kazil, who seemingly found a home in the secondary at safety. Kazil enters the 2006 campaign as RMU's leading returning tackler after finishing second on the club last season with 65 takedowns, including 33 solo stops. He also paced the Colonials in interceptions with three and over the course of his final eight games of the 2005 season averaged 7.5 tackles per contest.

**The Quiet One** - While a lot of attention is paid to the starting halfback and the number of yards that individual accumulates, one of the steadiest players on the Robert Morris club in the last four years has been senior fullback Vince Magnone. After seeing limited time as a freshman in 2002 and sitting out the 2003 season due to injury, Magnone has been a rock at fullback the last two years, accumulating 826 yards on the ground on 194 carries, an average of 4.3 yards a rush. Magnone etched his name into Colonial lore by registering his first, and only, 100-yard rushing game in the inaugural game at Joe Walton Stadium (9/17/05), a 49-13 win over Butler. He finished with 117 yards on 16 carries, an average of 7.3 yards per rush, and enters his final season in 2006 currently ranked seventh all-time at Robert Morris for career rushing yards. One thing has eluded Magnone thus far in his career, however, and that's hitting paydirt. Magnone has scored just one touchdown on his career, yet it came through the air, and has yet to record a touchdown rushing. A look at where Magnone stands in the RMU record book in rushing:

**Specialty** - Slowly, and quietly, moving his way up the rankings at Robert Morris for career points scored has been senior placekicker Nathan DiLorenzo. DiLorenzo enters the 2006 campaign with 138 points on his career, a total that currently ranks tied for fourth all-time with former flanker Tyjuan Massey (2002-05). Only two Colonials in school history have eclipsed 200 points in their careers, as former placekicker Jeff Carlo (1998-2001) owns the record of 250, while former running back Tim Hall (1994-95) scored 208.

D.J. Jazzy Jeff and the Fresh Princes - Senior outside linebacker Jeff Rommes enters his final season in 2006 as another important veteran piece to the Colonial defense, as he will look to help fill the spot of former middle linebacker James Noel (2002-05), the program's all-time leading tackler (437). In his first season at linebacker in 2005, Rommes tallied 53 tackles, including 17 solo. Rommes will team up at outside linebacker with junior Chad Wengert, who in his first full season of action in 2005 finished fourth on the club in tackles with 61. Getting the first crack at replacing Noel will be junior Jordan Howard, a special teams player his first two seasons with the club and primary backup to Noel.

The Magic Mark - Since the Colonials began play in 1994 there have been 54 games in which Robert Morris has scored 30 or more points. In those contests RMU boasts a record of 50-4, including a record of 26-4 in games in which the team scores between 30 and 39 points. In games in which the Colonials score 40 or more points, RMU is a perfect 23-0.
