Top Story - The Robert Morris University football team opens the home portion of its 2006 schedule Saturday afternoon when it welcomes crosstown rival Duquesne to Joe Walton Stadium for a 1:00 p.m. contest. RMU entered the 2006 season with an overall record of 43-16 (.729) at home in the program's first 12 years, posting a record of 41-13 (.759) in 11 seasons at Moon Stadium (1994-2004) and a 2-3 record in its inaugural season at "The Joe" in 2005. The Colonials opened their 2006 slate on the road, dropping a 21-14 decision @ Dayton (9/2/06). In that game RMU held a 14-0 advantage late into the third quarter, but the Flyers reeled off 21 unanswered points to pull out the win. Duquesne, meanwhile, is coming off a 31-28 overtime loss @ Bucknell (9/2/06) in its 2006 season opener. Robert Morris returns to the road after Saturday's tilt with the Dukes, traveling to Indianapolis, Indiana, for a 1:00 p.m. non-conference game at Butler Saturday, Sept. 16.

Quick Stat of the Afternoon - Robert Morris enters Saturday's game against Duquesne having had tremendous success in home openers, posting a record of 11-1 in its previous 12 home lidifters, with the only setback a 37-9 defeat against Dayton (9/8/01). Included in that stretch is a 49-13 victory over Butler (9/17/05) in the inaugural game at Joe Walton Stadium for the 2005 home opener. RMU certainly hasn't had a problem getting its offense going in home openers, either, as the Colonials have scored 35 or more points in eight of its 12 home openers and are averaging 35.7 points per game.

Saturday's Opponent - Robert Morris and Duquesne will meet for the eighth time Saturday, with the Colonials holding a 4-3 edge in the all-time series. The Dukes will be making their first trip to Joe Walton Stadium Saturday and just their third trip overall to Moon Township. In the two previous games in Moon Township at Moon Stadium, RMU garnered a 28-6 win Oct. 8, 1994, and a 34-14 victory Sept. 11, 2004.

Duquesne Series Quick Outs - Thanks to a 23-12 victory at Rooney Field in the 2005 season opener for both clubs, Duquesne has won three of the last four meetings between the two clubs ... Saturday's game pits two of the best I-AA Mid-Major programs since the classification was created in

1993, as Duquesne's .743 winning percentage over the last 13 years ranks second, while RMU's .619 mark ranks fourth.

Head Coach Joe Walton 13th Season - Pittsburgh '57



If there has been one constant associated with Robert Morris University football through the program's first 12 years, it has been Joe Walton. He was named head coach on July 27, 1993. He started the program from scratch, including everything from hiring assistant coaches to purchasing equipment to recruiting student-athletes. His fingerprints are all over the program, and to prove that, he had the University's first on-campus football stadium named in his honor. Joe Walton Stadium hosted its first football game in 2005 to rousing success, as the Colonials defeated Butler, 49-13, on Sept. 17, 2005.

"I've said this many times before, and I mean it when I say that this situation is one of the best things that has happened to me in my life," Walton said. "It happened at the right time. Before this position became available, I felt I was too young to quit coaching, but I wasn't anxious to get back into pro football. When this came along, it was the perfect fit. This situation was the perfect opportunity for me to continue to do what I like to do, and I've loved every minute of it."

Under Walton's tutelage, the Colonials have claimed five Northeast Conference titles and a pair of mid-major national crowns in the program's first 12 years of existence. Robert Morris is one of just two programs to claim a pair of victories in the ECAC Classic, having won it in back-to-back seasons in 1996 and 1997. The success has done nothing to dampen Walton's enthusiasm for coaching football at Robert Morris, and with him on the sideline RMU wins nearly 70 percent of the time.

Walton is RMU's only head coach ever, and he is 75-46-1 (all at Robert Morris) at the collegiate level (.619). Walton was the head coach of the New York Jets from 1983-89, when he went 53-57-1 (.482). Also included among Walton's 35 NFL seasons is two (1990-91) as offensive coordinator for the Pittsburgh Steelers. A two-time All-America tight end at Pittsburgh, Walton played eight years in the NFL with the Washington Redskins and New York Giants.

GAME RECAP

Welcome Stadium Attendance: 3,719 - Brandon Godsey's six-yard touchdown scamper with 1:37 to play lifted Dayton to a 21-14 victory over Robert Morris in the 2006 season opener for both clubs. The Colonials owned a 14-0 lead late in the third quarter but the Flyers responded with three rushing touchdowns in the last 16:54 of the game to take the win. Sophomore quarterback Erik Cwalinski finished 18-for-25 passing for 278 yards and two touchdowns, while senior tight end Jarvis Powers caught five passes for 79 yards and a score. Senior linebacker Jeff Rommes paced the RMU defense with 14 tackles.

Dayton Game Notes - A total of 10 Colonials made their first collegiate start against the Flyers, including two true freshman in running back **Brian Harden** and cornerback **Jacky Candy** ... Robert Morris reached the red zone three times against Dayton, scoring a pair of touchdowns ... RMU had 1st-and-10 from the UD 15-yard line on its second drive of the afternoon, but senior fullback **Moises Hernandez** fumbled on first down and Pat Weale recovered for Dayton ... Dayton finished 3-for-4 in the red zone against RMU ... Robert Morris converted 6-of-11 third downs and held UD to 3-of-12.

Offensively Speaking - Robert Morris got its 2006 season off on the right foot offensively in the season opener @ Dayton (9/2/2006), outgaining the Flyers on the afternoon in total offense, 374 yards to 305. What was even more impressive is that Dayton ran 19 more plays on offense than RMU, running 72 plays compared to just 53 for Robert Morris. The Colonials averaged 7.1 yards per play against the Flyers, their best such single-game mark since averaging 7.2 yards per play in a 40-7 victory @ Gannon (10/5/96), a stretch of 97 games.

Sack Attack - Robert Morris received inspired play from its defense in the 2006 season opener @ Dayton (9/2/06), keeping the Flyer ground game in check most of the afternoon while continually putting pressure on UD quarterback Kevin Hoyng. Senior defensive lineman **Ray Gensler** put the most pressure on Hoyng, sacking him three times and coming close to pulling him down on a pair of other occasions. Gensler became the sixth different Colonial in school history to tally at least three sacks in a game and the first since former defensive lineman Abu Sesay (1997-98) notched three against New Haven (11/14/98). Gensler now owns 11 sacks on his career entering Saturday's tilt against Duquesne and has an outside shot of becoming RMU's all-time sacks leader in 2006. It's Your Show - Sophomore **Erik Cwalinski** is in his first full season as the starting quarterback for Robert Morris, and he certainly proved he is up to the task of leading the 2006 Colonials after his performance in RMU's season opener @ Dayton (9/2/06). Cwalinski finished 18-for-25 passing for 278 yards and two touchdowns against the Flyers, completing a pass to eight different receivers in the process. In just five career starts Cwalinski has eclipsed 200 yards passing in three of them, including a career-high 307 yards passing in RMU's 2005 season finale against Sacred Heart (11/12/05).

Chicks Dig the Long Ball - Over the course of the past couple of seasons, Robert Morris has gone to the air a lot more than in the early years of the program. Seven of the 10 longest touchdown passes in school history have occurred in the last four years, mainly thanks to the arm of graduated quarterback Drew Geyer (2002-05). Sophomore **Erik Cwalinski** didn't take long to show that his arm is a powerful one, as well. Cwalinski's 79-yard touchdown strike to former flanker Tyjuan Massey in his first collegiate start @ Central Connecticut State (10/15/05) ranks as the fifth longest scoring pass in school history.

Stepping In, Stepping Up - A number of players have received opportunity to move into the starting lineup for the 2006 Colonials, and one who came through with a solid performance in RMU's 2006 season opener @ Dayton (9/2/06) was senior tight end **Jarvis Powers**. Powers paced the Robert Morris receiving corps against the Flyers, finishing with career highs in both receptions (5) and receiving yards (79) while also hauling in a 16-yard touchdown pass from sophomore quarterback **Erik Cwalinski** in the second quarter, just his second career touchdown reception.

Welcome Back - Despite the loss of the program's top two receivers in school history in former flanker Tyjuan Massey (2002-05) and former tight end Rupert Rickards (2002-05), the Colonials welcome back junior **Mario Hines** in 2006. Hines finished with 24 catches for 373 yards and two touchdowns as a freshman in 2004, then transferred to Akron. After participating in 2005 spring drills with the Zips, Hines returned to Robert Morris in the summer of 2005 but had to sit out last season due to NCAA transfer rules. It didn't take long for Hines to make an impact, either, as he finished with four catches for 46 yards and a touchdown @ Dayton (9/2/06). Hines also slipped into the special teams role of kickoff and punt returner vacated by Massey, as he finished with 67 yards on three kickoff and three punt returns to help him amass 113 all-purpose yards against the Flyers.

Mission Accomplished - A key reason Robert Morris was able to average 7.1 yards per play offensively @ Dayton (9/2/06) in the club's 2006 season opener was due to the play of the offensive line. Despite starting three players (sophomore **Ian Margerum** and juniors **Edgar Hunt** and **Joe Setticense**) who made their first start on the offensive line in a Colonial uniform, the group held up well, not allowing a sack on the afternoon. It's a solid start for Robert Morris, as the club allowed 32 sacks in 2005 and is coming off a stretch in the last four years (2002-05) in which it has allowed 58, 44, 39 and 32 sacks.

Jump Start - Needing someone to help fill the shoes of graduated senior linebacker James Noel (2002-05), the all-time leading tackler in Robert Morris school history, senior outside linebacker **Jeff Rommes** got his 2006 season started off on the right foot @ Dayton (9/2/06). Rommes notched his fourth career double-digit tackle game and established a career high in tackles with 14 against the Flyers, including 10 solo. He also registered a sack and a pass break-up on the afternoon.

Fresh Meat - While senior linebacker **Jeff Rommes** paced the RMU defense against Dayton, the Colonial defensive line and linebacking corps came through with a solid performance in the 2006 season opener @ Dayton (9/2/06). Led by senior defensive lineman **Ray Gensler**, the defensive line tallied 19 tackles against the Flyers, including four takedowns each from senior **Colyn Haugh** and junior **Kelvern Grant**. Robert Morris also received 26 tackles from its linebacking corps, as joining Rommes (14 takedowns) was junior **Jordan Howard** with a career-high eight stops and four from junior **Chad Wengert**. Of the group, Grant and Howard were each making their first collegiate starts.

Anchorman - One of the most pleasant surprises on the Robert Morris defense in 2005 was junior defensive back **James Kazil**, who seemingly found a home in the secondary at safety. Kazil finished second on the club last season with 65 takedowns, including 33 solo stops, and started his 2006 season @ Dayton (9/2/06) with eight tackles and an interception. Over the course of his last nine games dating back to the 2005 campaign, Kazil is averaging 7.6 tackles per game while leading the club in picks with four.

The Quiet One - While a lot of attention is paid to the starting halfback and the number of yards that individual accumulates, one of the steadiest players on the Robert Morris club in the last four years has been senior fullback **Vince Magnone**. After seeing limited time as a freshman in 2002 and sitting out the 2003 season due to injury, Magnone has been a rock at fullback the last three years, accumulating 846 yards on the ground on 200 carries, an average of 4.2 yards a rush. Magnone etched his name into Colonial lore by registering his first, and only, 100-yard rushing game in the inaugural game at Joe Walton Stadium (9/17/05), a 49-13 win over Butler. He finished with 117 yards on 16 carries, an average of 7.3 yards per rush, and currently ranks seventh all-time at Robert Morris for career rushing yards. One thing has eluded Magnone thus far in his career, however, and that's hitting paydirt. Magnone has scored just one touchdown on his career, yet it came through the air, and has yet to record a touchdown rushing. A look at where Magnone stands in the RMU record book in rushing:

Specialty - Slowly, and quietly, moving his way up the rankings at Robert Morris for career points scored has been senior placekicker **Nathan DiLorenzo**. DiLorenzo owns 140 points on his career, a total that currently ranks third all-time. Only two Colonials in school history have eclipsed 200 points in their careers, as former placekicker Jeff Carlo (1998-2001) owns the record of 250, while former running back Tim Hall (1994-95) scored 208.

Moving and Shaking - Freshman **Brian Harden** joined former running back Archie Wannamaker (1996-98) as just the second Colonial in school history to garner a start at halfback in his first collegiate game in RMU's 2006 season opener @ Dayton (9/2/06), and he finished the afternoon with 48 yards on 17 carries, an average of 2.8 yards per carry. His longest run of the afternoon came in the first quarter when he scampered around the left end and sprinted 15 yards down to the Dayton 44-yard line. Covering All The Corners - Robert Morris featured a pair of fresh faces at cornerback in its season opener @ Dayton (9/2/06), with freshman **Jacky Candy** and senior **Mike Niklos** receiving starts. Candy was making his first collegiate start and provided four tackles, including three solo, while Niklos added three stops and a pass breakup. Niklos returned to the Colonials at cornerback in 2006 after sitting out the 2005 season with an ankle injury.

2006 Colonial Football Game Notes - (9/9/06 vs. Duquesne)

Skill Set - Despite the loss of the program's top two receiving threats, Robert Morris remains deep in its stable of receivers. As well as senior tight end **Jarvis Powers** and junior split end **Mario Hines**, the Colonials received solid play @ Dayton (9/2/06) from junior **Alvin Hill** and senior **Michael Rogers**. Hill finished with three catches for 66 yards against the Flyers, while Rogers chipped in with two catches for 57 yards.

Did You Know? RMU owns an all-time record of 63-7 when getting to halftime with a lead but have dropped each of their last four games when such an occurrence happens. The Colonials held a 14-0 advantage in the season opener @ Dayton (9/2/06) but fell in the contest, 21-14.

The Magic Mark - Since the Colonials began play in 1994 there have been 54 games in which Robert Morris has scored 30 or more points. In those contests RMU boasts a record of 50-4, including a record of 26-4 in games in which the team scores between 30 and 39 points. In games in which the Colonials score 40 or more points, RMU is a perfect 23-0.
