Top Story - The Robert Morris University men's basketball team looks to even its 2005-06 record at .500 Monday night when it hosts America East Conference foe Maine at the Charles L. Sewall Center for a 7:30 p.m. non-conference game. The Colonials are coming off a 100-64 victory over Division II Lock Haven (11/26/05) in their 2005-06 home opener, the 11th time in school history RMU has scored at least 100 points in a contest. After Monday night's tilt against the Black Bears, the Colonials open a three-game road trip with a 7:05 p.m. game at crosstown rival Duquesne (12/3/05). During the road swing RMU will also travel to New Hampshire (12/6/05) and will open Northeast Conference action with a 4:00 p.m. tilt @ Quinnipiac (12/10/05).

Quick Stat of the Night - Despite RMU's success in home openers over the first 30 years of Division I basketball (26-4 overall record), the Colonials have had a tougher time winning back-to-back home games to open their season, especially in the last 10 years. Since the 1995-96 season, Robert Morris has started 2-0 at home just four times, including once under fifth-year head coach Mark Schmidt. The Colonials started the 2003-04 campaign by winning each of its first five home games. Last season, despite a 107-47 win over Thiel (11/29/05) in its 2004-05 home opener, Robert Morris fell to Quinnipiac (12/4/04), 88-85, in its Northeast Conference opener at the Sewall Center.

Monday's Opponent and the All-Time Series

- Maine and Robert Morris will square off for just the third time Monday night, with the Colonials having won the two previous meetings in the all-time series. RMU and the Black Bears played a home-and-home series during the 1989-90 and 1990-91 campaigns, with Robert Morris garnering a 73-57 win (12/30/89) in Orono, Maine, before posting an 81-62 win (12/29/90) at the Charles L. Sewall Center. Monday's game is the first of another home-and-home series with Maine, as the Colonials will visit the Black Bears during the 2006-07 season.

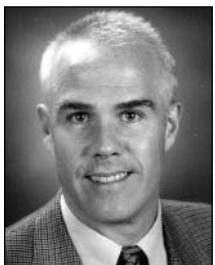

Head Coach Mark Schmidt Fifth Season - Boston College '85



The 2005-06 campaign marks **Mark Schmidt's** fifth year as head coach of the men's basketball program at Robert Morris University. He owns an overall record of 51-67 (.432), including a 39-35 (.527) mark in the Northeast Conference, and was named to his current post May 7, 2001. Schmidt guided the Colonials to an overall record of 14-15 in both 2003-04 and 2004-05. In 2004-05, Schmidt guided the Colonials to a third-place finish in the NEC, the program's best standing since 2000. During the 2003-04 campaign, RMU tied for fourth in the league and

advanced to the NEC Tournament semifinals for the first time since 2000. In 2001-02, Schmidt led Robert Morris to a 12-18 overall record, the most victories for a first-year head coach in the 29-year history of the RMU men's basketball program.

Prior to RMU, Schmidt spent seven seasons as one of the nation's top assistants at Xavier University under current Wake Forest head coach Skip Prosser from 1994-2001. While with the Musketeers, Schmidt played a dual role, serving as both a coach and the program's top recruiter. His coaching responsibilities centered mostly around the post players, and he helped develop and recruit players at Xavier that have moved on to the professional ranks, including James Posey (Memphis Grizzlies), David West (New Orleans Hornets), Romain Sato (San Antonio Spurs), Lionel Chalmers (Minnesota Timberwolves) and David Young (Seattle Supersonics). Prior to his stint with Xavier, Schmidt served one year as an assistant at Loyola College in Baltimore, Md., also under Prosser. He also spent two seasons at Penn State University under Bruce Parkhill from 1991-93, and started his coaching career as an assistant at St. Michael's College in Vermont from 1989-91.

Schmidt's playing career was highlighted by four years as a guard/forward at Boston College, where he received his bachelor's degree in business administration and management with a concentration in marketing in 1985. The Eagles went 22-10 and made the NCAA Elite Eight during his freshman season in 1981-82 under head coach Tom Davis and 25-7 the next year in making the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen in his first of three years playing for current Maryland coach Gary Williams. Boston College reached the NIT second round in 1984 and the NCAA Sweet Sixteen again in 1985.

Scouting the Black Bears - Maine enters Monday night's game with Robert Morris sporting an overall record of 1-3 and is coming off a 62-49 loss to Pittsburgh (11/26/05) at the Petersen Events Center. In that game senior guard Ernest Turner led the Black Bears with 15 points, while junior guard Jon Sheets added 14. Turner and Sheets are Maine's two top leading scorers, as Turner is averaging 20.5 points per game while Sheets scores at a 12.5 points per game clip.

Maine Head Coach - In his second season as head coach at Maine is **Ted Woodward (Bucknell '86)**, who helped guide the Black Bears to a 14-15 record last season. Prior to being named the 20th head coach in Maine history, Woodward spent the previous eight years as an assistant with the Black Bears, including associate head coach during the 2003-04 campaign.

RMU's Last Game - Robert Morris opened the home portion of its 2005-06 schedule with a 100-64 victory over Lock Haven Nov. 26. Lock Haven shot out of the gates to a 6-2 lead thanks to three-pointers from Michael Dye and James Chappell, but the Colonials came right back to take a 7-6 lead after a three-pointer from junior guard **Derek Coleman** and a jumper by sophomore guard **Tony Lee**. Another three-pointer by Chappell for the Bald Eagles gave LHU a 9-7 advantage with 16:59 to play in the first half, and Chappell's fastbreak layup after a steal pushed Lock Haven to an 11-7 lead. The Bald Eagles increased their lead to 14-9 after another layup from Chappell at the 15:13 mark of the first half, but Robert Morris used a 19-7 run to open up a 28-17 advantage with 7:53 to play before halftime. Lee scored seven points to lead the Colonial surge, while freshman guard **Jeremy Chappell** hit a pair of three-pointers. On three different occasions Lock Haven was able to cut its deficit to eight, the last of which came at the 4:23 mark of the first half after a pair of free throws by Bruce Kennedy closed the RMU lead to 35-27. The Colonials, however, used an 18-8 run over the last four minutes of the first stanza to take a 53-35 advantage into the break. Lee and junior forward **A.J. Jackson** led the charge in the first half for the Colonials, as each scored 13 points. Jackson hit nine of his 13 free-throw attempts in the first half and also added nine rebounds, including six on the offensive glass. Jackson opened the second half scoring with a jumper to push Robert Morris to a 55-35 lead, and Lock Haven was able to close its deficit to 17 on two occasions early in the half, once on a three-pointer from James Chappell and the other on a layup by Tony Gamble. RMU would open up an 85-51 lead with 7:48 remaining thanks to a 28-11 run in which eight different Colonials scored, including five points from Jackson and four from sophomore guard **Cori Boston**. Jackson paced four Colonials in double figures scoring with 20 points while notching his first career double-double with 12 rebounds. Jeremy Chappell finished with 16 points for RMU, while Lee added 15 and Boston 12.

Smooth Transition - Robert Morris got its first look at junior forward **A.J. Jackson** in its two games last week, and the transfer from East Tennessee State didn't disappoint. In games against Pitt (11/23/05) and Lock Haven (11/26/05), Jackson averaged 16.5 points and 8.5 rebounds and recorded his first career double-double with 20 points and 12 rebounds in a 100-64 win over Lock Haven. Jackson could also be a factor for the Colonials on the glass this season, as 10 of his 17 total rebounds in the early going have come on the offensive end.

The Total Package - Sophomore guard **Tony Lee's** transition from green rookie to chiseled veteran has gone seamlessly so far in 2005-06, as Lee came through with a complete performance in a 100-64 win over Lock Haven. On the night Lee scored 15 points while grabbing seven rebounds and adding a career-high nine assists and four steals.

Consistent Cori - Sophomore forward **Cori Boston** went through an up-and-down season as a freshman in 2004-05, not only serving as the understudy to two-time All-Northeast Conference First Team selection Chaz McCrommon but battling various injuries throughout the year. Boston, one of three players on the club from Charlestown High School in Boston, Mass., has been a pleasant surprise for Robert Morris in the early portion of the 2005-06 season. He is the only Colonial to score in double figures in each of RMU's first three games this season, despite being RMU's top option coming off the bench with the return of junior forward **A.J. Jackson** from injury. On the young season Boston is averaging 12.7 points and 4.7 caroms a contest.

Concentration - A key reason sophomore forward **Cori Boston** has improved with increased playing time this season has been due to his ability to concentrate at the free-throw line. After converting just three of his 12 opportunities from the charity stripe as a freshman in 2004-05, Boston has converted 10-of-12 this season to lead the Colonials in the early going in free throws, free throw attempts and free-throw percentage (83.3 percent). Boston currently ranks seventh in the Northeast Conference in free throw percentage.

Rookie or Veteran? Freshman guard **Jeremy Chappell** has quietly gotten off to a solid start in his collegiate career in the early portion of the 2005-06 campaign for Robert Morris. Chappell enters Monday night's game against Maine coming off a 16-point, five-rebound performance in a 100-64 victory over Lock Haven (11/26/05) and on the season is averaging 11.0 points and 4.3 rebounds a contest. Chappell has shown a nice shooting touch in the early going, as he has converted 48 percent (12-for-25) of his field goal opportunities, including 6-for-12 (50.0 percent) from beyond the arc.

A Dime a Dozen - Junior guard **Derek Coleman**, after starting RMU's season-opener @ St. Bonaventure (11/18/05) at shooting guard due to the injury of sophomore guard **Tony Lee**, moved back to point guard @ Pittsburgh (11/23/05) and while scoring 10 points established a new career-high in assists with eight. Through three games on the 2005-06 Coleman has dished out 18 assists while committing just eight turnovers, continuing a trend from the 2004-05 campaign. In his last 24 games of the 2004-05 campaign, Coleman dished out 90 assists (3.75 per game) while committing just 39 turnovers. Thanks to his totals in RMU's first three games this season Coleman owns 108 assists (4.00 per game) against 47 turnovers in his last 27 games.

Washington "D.C." - While guard **Derek Coleman** has been known as a pass first, score second player over his first two years with the club, the junior will be counted upon to pick up his offensive production in 2005-06. Coleman put together an all-around game in RMU's season opener @ St. Bonaventure (11/18/05), leading the team in both rebounds (5) and assists (6) while adding seven points on the evening. Those numbers are indicative of what Coleman did in the second half of the 2004-05 campaign, when he averaged 10.8 points, 4.2 rebounds and 4.4 assists in the last 14 games of the season. Over his last 17 games dating back to last season, Coleman is averaging 10.4 points, 4.0 rebounds and 4.6 assists per game.

Balance Beam - Looking to replace a large chunk of offensive production this season due to the loss of former Colonials Chaz McCrommon and Maurice Carter, Robert Morris has found offense from a number of players and looks to have the making of a more balanced attack in 2005-06. Through the first three games of the season, seven different Colonials have already had a game scoring in double figures, led by sophomore guard **Cori Boston**, who is the only player to score in double figures in each of RMU's three contests.

Iron Men - Junior point guard **Derek Coleman** and freshman guard **Jeremy Chappell** each logged a full 40 minutes of action in RMU's season opener @ St. Bonaventure (11/18/05), with Chappell finishing with eight points and four rebounds against the Bonnies. Chappell had all eight of his points and three of his rebounds in the first half. In the early going of the 2005-06 campaign, a trend is developing that Coleman and Chappell could quickly become RMU's two iron men this season. Through the first three games of the season, Coleman has played 102 of a possible 120 minutes, while Chappell has played 101 of a possible 120 minutes.

A Sign of Things to Come? Freshman guards **Jeremy Chappell** and **Jonathan Clark** joined a small fraternity in Robert Morris basketball history @ St. Bonaventure (11/18/05). By being members of the starting lineup, Chappell and Clark became just the third and fourth Colonials in school history to earn a start as a true freshman in their first collegiate game. The other two Colonials to start as true freshman in their Robert Morris debuts were **Keith Jones (1995-99)** and **Forest Grant (1980-84)**. Both of those two went on to solid careers at Robert Morris, as each finished with over 1,000 points (Grant - 1,494 and Jones - 1,277), while Jones ranks second in career rebounds (642) and Grant is the all-time leader in assists (555).

Three Ball, Side Pocket - While defense plays an important role in the current coaching structure of Robert Morris basketball, so does the three-point shot. In RMU's five seasons with head coach **Mark Schmidt** at the helm, the Colonials have averaged 7.15 three-pointers per game and have hit at least 10 three-pointers in a game a total of 28 times, including once on the 2005-06 campaign. Robert Morris has continued that trend this season despite the loss of the top two three-point shooters in school history each of the last two seasons. Former forward **Aaron Thomas (2000-04)** finished his career with a school record 218 trifectas, while former guard **Maurice Carter (2001-05)** finished second in the RMU annals with 217 career three-point field goals. Thomas and Carter, in fact, finished as the top three-point tandem in school history. Junior guard **Derek Coleman** returns as the top three-point threat for Robert Morris, having hit 45 trifectas a year ago. **A look at the top three-point Robert Morris tandems in school history:**

Defense Wins Championships - Head coach **Mark Schmidt** has preached over the course of his five years as head coach that a suffocating defense will lead to victories, and his mantra was proven correct in 2004-05. In RMU's 14 victories on the 2004-05 campaign, opponents shot just 43.7 percent (326-for-746) from the field and averaged just 61.5 points per game. In contrast, in the 15 losses suffered by the Colonials in 2004-05, opponents converted 51.6 percent (425-for-824) of its field goal attempts and averaged 78.3 points per contest. The bell rings true when the statement is made that defense wins championships, as the Colonials were **12-3** on the **2004-05** campaign when holding their opponent under **70** points in a game. In **all** under Schmidt, RMU is **42-15 (.737)** when holding opponents under **70** points a contest.

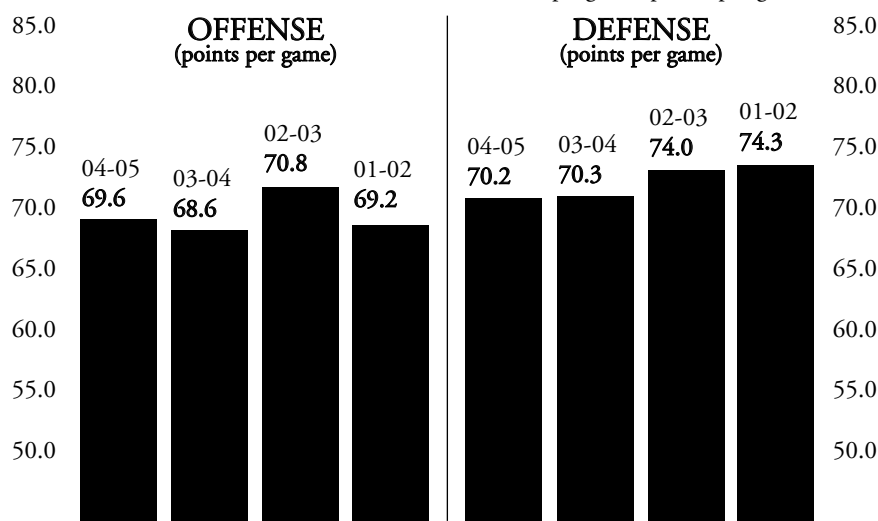

The Need for Three

The Colonials have relied heavily on the three-point shot under the direction of **Mark Schmidt** during his four years as head coach, compiling a single-season school record 213 in 2003-04, two more than the 2001-02 club, which set a school record with 211. On the 2004-05 campaign, RMU averaged 7.00 three-pointers a game and was led by former guard Maurice Carter with 47, while junior guard **Derek Coleman** added 45. Since the start of the 2001-02 season, the Colonials rank third in the conference in three-pointers made per game (7.15), behind only St. Francis (N.Y.)
